Email Notices

Keep your e-mail address current with the library in order to receive notices that your **requests** have arrived, get **courtesy notices** the day before an item is due, and **overdue notices** if your items are late. PLEASE NOTE: If your spam filter requires a form to be completed to allow access to e-mails from the library, you must add e-mails for the domains **mail.owls.lib.wi.us** and **mail.nfls.lib.wi.us** to your approved list. Bouncebacks from spam filters may cause your e-mail address to be deleted from your contact record.

As with other library information, the privacy of your e-mail address and communications are protected under state law (Wis. Stat. 43.30). They will never be given away, sold, or traded to a third party.

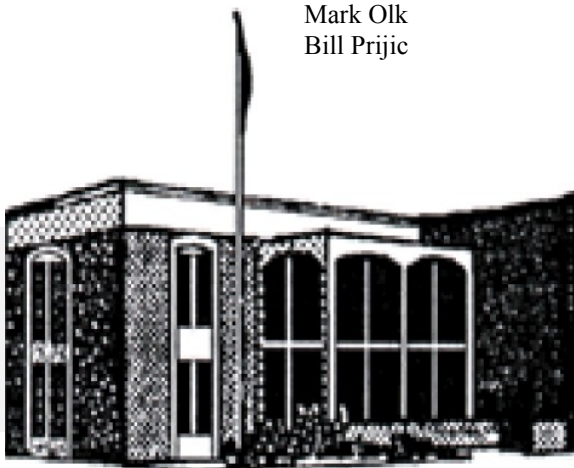
The Hortonville Public Library needs your support. The Library is an essential part of our community's life. Please be generous in supporting the Library.
