As part of a 2009 Institute of Museum and Library Services grant, the Hortonville Public Library, along with other members of the Outagamie Waupaca Library System, received money to purchase a collection of books to support job hunters, including books on writing resumes and cover letters, preparing for interviews, and searching for new jobs and careers.

In addition to books, the grant helped to support the purchase of an online resume writing program, Optimal Resume. Optimal Resume provides an easy way to build, and print resumes and cover letters. InfoSoup to Go! is brought to you using AirPAC technology from Innovative Interfaces, Inc, and was purchased by the Outagamie Waupaca Library System with an LSTA grant.

National Do Not Call Registry

The National Do Not Call Registry gives you a choice about whether to receive telemarketing calls at home. Most telemarketers should not call your number once it has been on the registry for 31 days. If they do, you can file a complaint at this Website <https://www.donotcall.gov/> You can register your home or mobile phone for free. Telephone numbers placed on the National Do Not Call Registry will remain on it permanently due to the Do-Not-Call Improvement Act of 2007, which became law in February 2008. 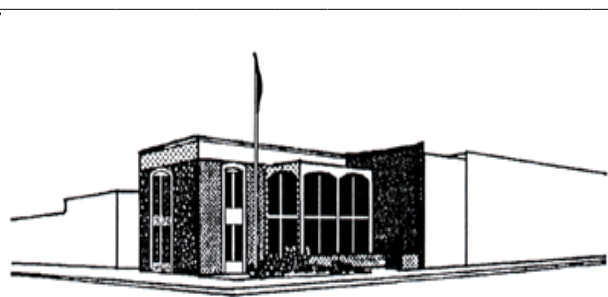
Wheeled Walker
